

# The Rome Summer School in Latin and History: The Eternal City: from Paganism to Christianity

Explore Latin language and Roman History through guided readings from Cicero to St. Augustine. Read pagan and Christian texts in their original home. Study classical art and its influence on Western Civilization. Attend classes on Latin palaeography and epigraphy. Included are excursions to the major sites of the Historical Centre of Rome, Hadrian's Villa at Tivoli, and an overnight tour to the Abbey of Montecassino, Pompeii and Naples.

This 3-week intensive course will be held at Domus Australia, a comfortable and charming guest house established by the Catholic Church in Australia for travellers and pilgrims to Rome ([www.domusaustralia.org](http://www.domusaustralia.org)).

**Prerequisite:** Latin (introductory level) at tertiary level, or equivalent. Readings will be graded from basic to complex, so that those less experienced in the language will make

comfortable progress. Enrolment is open to all. Anyone interested in humane studies in the Eternal City will benefit from this experience. Even relative beginners in Latin, who are willing to work hard on the language prior to departure, will make excellent progress. Lectures (3 hours each weekday) are held in the mornings, leaving afternoons free for tours and private study.

- ❖ The total cost of the land component is approximately \$2,850 (to be finalised) and includes: accommodation including breakfast; welcome and farewell dinners; three half-day excursions to Tivoli, Cerveteri and the Archaeological Park of Via Appia; a weekend excursion to Pompeii and Herculaneum with overnight stay in Napoli; entries to museums and archaeological parks. Tuition fees are to be paid separately.
- ❖ Lan205 - The Eternal City from Paganism to Christianity is a fully accredited subject. Champion students who wish to attend the school and earn 6 credit points can pay their tuition fee of \$1,995.00 through the FEE HELP Scheme of deferred payment. Students from other institutions should check with their home institution before enrolling as credit-earning students. Those who do not wish to earn credits will pay an up-front nominal tuition fee of \$990.00.
- ❖ Participants should allow for up to an additional €25-30 per day for lunches and dinners.
- ❖ Students should make their own travel arrangements which include airfares, travel insurance and airport transfers. Classes commence on Monday, 30th June 2014 and end on Friday, 18th July 2014.
