Outline of Course

Beginners

| Level | Guide to levels | Texts (available c.mid November) |
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| 1A | This is for complete beginners with no prior knowledge of the language. Tutor: Anne Rogerson and Chris Stait | A composite course book will be provided |
| 1B | This will begin with the basics, and move into simple translation with lots of grammar. For those who have begun Latin but have not progressed very far. Tutor: Barbara Twomey and Thomas Wilson | A composite course book will be provided |

Starting again

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| 1C | If you did some Latin (or a long time ago!) and want to go back to the beginning, this is the course for you. It will cover grammar and readings. Tutor: Phillip Johnson | A composite course book will be provided |
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Intermediate

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| 2A | This requires some knowledge of Latin grammar which will be developed. Tutors: John Coombs and Mike Salter | A composite course book will be provided |
| 2B | This will have greater emphasis on extensive graded readings with prior preparation. Grammar will be revised and extended. You should be familiar with all tenses and cases, but not necessarily passives or subjunctives. Tutors: Alexander Westenberg and Michael Hanaghan | A composite course book will be provided |
| 2C | This will be more challenging than 2B, with plenty of grammar and readings. Tutor: Mary Jane Cuyler | A composite course book will be provided |

Intermediate plus

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| 3A | This is designed to widen your reading experience in original Latin (with preparation) and will include work on grammar, interpretation and reading technique. Suitable for yr 11/12 students and undergraduates with one year's Latin. Tutors: (1) Anne Richardson (2) Jane Williams (3) Erica Bexley | You will have three teachers, once each day, and read all three groups of texts: (1) Cicero and Pliny: thoughts about religion (2) Didactic poetry: Lucretius, Virgil, Horace, Ovid (3) Neronian literature |
| 3B (i) | Both of these courses involve a wider range of readings requiring preparation. Grammar will be explained as needed. Tutors: Alison Waters and Roger Pitcher | Medieval Latin |
| 3B (ii) | Tutors: Michelle McVeigh and Sarah Lawrence | Rate your Roman: ethical dilemmas in Latin literature |

Advanced

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| 4 (1-5) | This level will be reading-based, and texts may be allocated for translation in class. Attention will be paid to literary analysis and grammatical problems. Tutors: Group A (9.30am) (1) Anthony Alexander (2) Ian McLeod | There will be two sessions each day, and participants are to choose two, one from group 4A and 4X, and one from group 4B and 4Y. Please indicate a second preference. 1) Cicero, Pro Milone 2) Ovid, Metamorphoses |
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| | Group B (11.15am) (3) Paul Roche (4) Ioannis Ziogas | 3) Cicero's Letters 4) Catullus |
| 4X & 4Y | This is reading-based with more attention given to interpretation than translation. The emphasis will be on matters social, historical, or literary. Discussion encouraged. Tutors: 4X (9.30am) Bob Cowan 4Y (11.15) Elizabeth Minchin | Roman evolutions Horace, Odes |
