Outline of Course

BEGINNERS

Level 1A This is for complete beginners with no prior knowledge of the language. Students will be introduced to Latin pronunciation and sentence structure as well as basic grammar and syntax. Topics to be covered include: first and second declension nouns, first-second declension adjectives, first and second conjugation verbs (present and imperfect tenses), the irregular verbs “to be” and “to be able”, prepositions and conjunctions. A composite course booklet will be provided.

Level 1B This will begin with the basics, and move into simple translation with lots of grammar. For those who have begun Latin but have not progressed very far. Topics to be covered include: first, second and third declension nouns and adjectives, comparative and superlative adjectives, indicative active verbs (present, imperfect, perfect and pluperfect), imperative and infinitive verbs. A composite course booklet will be provided.

STARTING AGAIN

Level 1C If you did some Latin some time (or a long time!) ago and want to go back to the beginning, this is the course for you. It will cover grammar and readings. Grammar topics to be covered depend on the needs of the class, but might include: nouns (all declensions), verbs (all conjugations), indirect commands, statements and questions, result and purpose clauses, expressions of wish, gerunds and gerundives, and case usage. A composite course booklet will be provided.

INTERMEDIATE

Level 2A This requires some knowledge of Latin grammar which will be developed, and classes will be split between reading passages of original Latin and grammar work. Grammar topics to be covered depend on the needs of the class, but might include: the introduction of subjunctive forms, indirect statements, ablative absolutes, and conditionals. A composite course booklet will be provided.

Level 2B This will have greater emphasis on extensive graded readings with (optional) prior preparation, while grammar will be revised and extended. You should be familiar with all tenses and cases, but not necessarily passives or subjunctives. Grammar topics to be covered depend on the needs of the class, but might include: revision of verb forms (and introduction of passive or subjunctive forms as required), word order and tactics for reading Latin sentences, gerunds and gerundives, case usage, uses of the subjunctive, revision of noun and adjective declensions and participles. A composite course booklet will be provided.

Level 2C This will be more challenging than 2B, with plenty of readings and grammar revision. Prior preparation of the readings is essential. Grammar topics to be

covered depend on the needs of the class, but might include: uses of the ablative, ablative absolutes, gerunds and gerundives, purpose and result clauses, sequence of tenses, indirect statements, relative clauses in indirect discourse. A composite course booklet will be provided.

INTERMEDIATE PLUS

Level 3A This is designed to widen your reading experience with a variety of original Latin texts, and will include work on style, interpretation, scansion and reading technique. Prior preparation of the readings is essential. Grammar will be explained as needed. Suitable for students sitting the HSC exams in 2015, and for undergraduates with one year's Latin.

You will have three teachers, once each day, and read all three groups of texts.

Level 3B The courses at Level 3B involve a wider range of readings requiring preparation. Grammar will be explained as needed. For students who already have an HSC qualification in Latin (or equivalent). Composite course booklets will be provided.

Tutors and topics:

(i) Alison Waters and Roger Pitcher: Mediaeval Latin (N.B. this class will only run for the two morning sessions each day, and students taking it will be free to attend a Special Interest Group in the afternoon).

(ii) Sarah Lawrence and Michelle McVeigh: Rome vs Rome: civil conflict and domestic disputes

ADVANCED

Level 4 This level will be reading-based, and texts may be allocated for translation in class. Students are expected to have prepared the texts in advance and discussion is encouraged. Attention will be paid to literary analysis, grammatical and textual problems, and social and historical context. In the 4.X and 4.Y classes in particular, more attention is given to interpretation than translation. There will be two sessions each day, and participants choose one class from each session. Optional special interest classes will be offered for Level 4 students in the afternoons (you sign up for these on the first day of the summer school). Composite course booklets will be provided.

SCHOOL STUDENT APPLICATIONS

School student applications must be accompanied by endorsement of a Latin teacher (unless you are an absolute beginner) and a letter from a parent or guardian. The parental consent and teacher endorsement forms can be downloaded from the LSS website:

The lower age limit to attend the LSS is 14. Total beginners may enrol in 1A. Those in 1B should have done at least a semester of Latin. All other students must be entering at least Year 9 in 2016. 3A is the highest level available for school students.
